THE ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION OF CATTLE (ANIMAL HEALTH) REGULATIONS 1985, AS AMENDED.


BULL: LORD RANNOCH OF LUCIES

BREED: HIGHLAND

- 1 Thank you for your application seeking EC approval of the above-named bull for use in artificial insemination of cattle.
- 2 A veterinary officer appointed by the Secretary of State from your local animal health office should be contacting you, within 10 working days of the date of this letter, to make arrangements to examine and test the bull to determine whether it/they meets the usual departmental health standards for approval. If you have not heard from the local office within that time, it is suggested that you contact them direct. But, please note that all other enquires relating to your application should be made to AI Section at the above address.
- 3 The bull needs to be in effective isolation when the veterinary examination is carried out and it must remain there until it is moved onto the licensed AI Centre. The veterinary officer will check on the suitability of accommodation being provided for this purpose.
- 4 If the results of the veterinary examination and tests are satisfactory the bull will be approved under the Artificial Insemination of Cattle (Animal Health) (England and Wales) Regulations 1985. A letter will be sent to you/ the owner(s) (copy to you) setting out the conditions to which the approval is subject.
- 5 One of the conditions of approval will be that semen can only be collected for processing at a specified AI Centre. No restriction will be imposed on the quantity of semen collected. If you have not already done so you should contact the AI Centre to begin making arrangements for collection of semen. Please note however, that no collection of semen may be made, other than for semen evaluation purposes, until the bull has been approved.
- 6 Finally, the AI Centre veterinary surgeon will require to see the results of the tests carried on the bull by the veterinary officer appointed by the Secretary of States as a pre-requisite to the

bull being admitted to the Centre. If you have **not** given authority for the disclosure of the test results to the AI Centre veterinary surgeon please read carefully the **Note below** as guidance on this matter.

DISCLOSURE OF TEST RESULTS

A bull cannot be moved to an AI Centre without the Secretary of State's permission. However, the final decision as to whether or not to accept the animal is taken by the AI Centre's veterinary surgeon and he will require details of the result of the tests carried out on the bull by the veterinary officer appointed by the Secretary of State. The results of the tests may not be divulged to the AI Centre's veterinary surgeon without the owner's written permission. **If the bull is approved and if you have no objection to the results of the tests being sent to the AI Centre's Veterinary surgeon, please inform me in writing as soon as possible.** If you decide not to do so your application for approval will be processed in the usual way but the details of the test result required by the Centre will be sent to you with the approval letter and you will be responsible for supplying them to the Centre.

APPROVAL OF A BULL FOR USE IN THE ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION OF CATTLE

BULL: LORD RANNOCH OF LUCIES
EAR MARKS: UK WE0507 00002

BREED: HIGHLAND

1. The above named bull has been approved for use in artificial insemination under regulation 5(1) of the Artificial Insemination of Cattle (Animal Health) (England and Wales) Regulations 1985 as amended and is hereby authorised to move to the isolation accommodation associated with the EC approved semen collection centre at **UK Sires Services Ltd, Venton Stud, Tigley, Dartington, Devon.**

2. Pursuant to regulation 5(4) of the regulations, this approval is subject to the following conditions:

- a) until it is moved to the isolation accommodation at the semen collection centre, the bull must be kept at all times in the isolation accommodation approved by a veterinary officer appointed by the Secretary of State.

Please note that Directive 88/407/EEC (as amended) requires the first stage on farm tests to have been carried out within the 30 days prior to the bull's movement to centre isolation. It is therefore important that the bull's movement to centre isolation should not be delayed;

- b) the bull must remain in the isolation accommodation at the semen collection centre for at least 30 days and during this time must undergo with negative results the tests prescribed at Annex B, Chapter I, Paragraph 1(e) of Directive 88/407/EEC (as amended). Semen must not be collected during this isolation period;
- c) semen shall be collected from the approved bull only on the **UK Sires Services Ltd, Venton Stud, Tigley, Dartington, Devon** semen collection centre veterinary registration number **UK 30**;

- d) if bovine spongiform encephalopathy is confirmed in the bull, its dam or surrogate dam, the owner shall notify this office as soon as practicable.
3. Pursuant to regulation 5(6) the owner of the approved bull or owner of any semen from the approved bull must notify the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs as soon as practicable if it is ever known or suspected that any progeny of the bull has shown any signs of abnormality.
4. Pursuant to regulations 5(10) and (12) the owner shall
- a) inform the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs of the death of the approved bull, the circumstances in which it occurred and the result of any post-mortem examination;
- b) notify the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs of any change of ownership of the approved bull.

Further Information

5. If considered necessary, having regard to the result of any veterinary test or examination, the use of semen collected from a bull between specified dates may be prohibited by notice served on the owner of the bull. (Regulation 5(7)).
6. The approval of this bull may be suspended or revoked or may be made subject to any new condition or conditions. Any condition to which the approval was made subject may be modified, suspended or revoked. (Regulation 5(8)).
7. Although every effort has been made to check that this bull is not the progeny of a dam or surrogate dam in which bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) has been confirmed, the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs is only able to check information provided to it against known cases of dams or surrogate dams which have developed BSE. No guarantee can therefore be given that the dam or surrogate dam of the bull referred to in this approval has not developed BSE. **This paragraph does not apply to bulls imported in to this country.**
8. A copy of this letter is being sent to the centre.
